

A tip for people interested in volunteering or participating in this program, is to take that risk of learning new things through non-formal education. The most beautiful things happen beyond the comfort zone.


If you could describe Speechless Reconciliation in one sentence, what would that be?


Our first Alumni Engager webinar with Adam Volf
